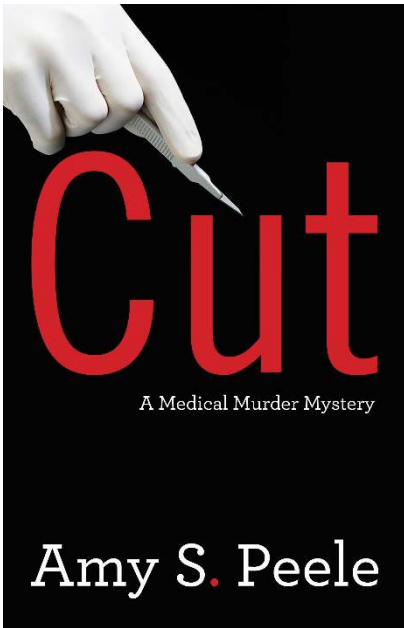


CUT A MEDICAL MURDER MYSTERY – by Amy S. Peele
